
Jamie's Animal Rescue Foster Form

I hope you understand that I do appreciate you even offering to foster, but it is ALWAYS important for a rescue to make sure their animals are going into wonderful care.



•	Do you understand that rescues are not usually trained, meaning they will need to be potty trained, and obedience trained?
•	How many animals do you have in your household?
•	Species/Breed/Weight of your animals in the household?
•	Are your personal pets up to date on vaccines?
•	Are your personal pets spayed/neutered?
•	Please describe your pet's personalities. In DETAIL.
•	Have your pets ever had another animal come into their home before? If so; how do they react?
•	If you have other pets; what is the feeding routine like? Free feeding / scheduled feeding / fed in crates
•	Do you have a backyard?
•	If so, What type of fencing do you have?
•	Is there anywhere in your backyard that a dog could escape from?
•	Do you have a swimming pool?

- What would you do if the dog disappeared?
- Do you understand that all animals deserve patience and love, even if they are scared and timid at first?
- How do you plan on socializing and exercising the dog/puppy?
- Have you ever fostered before? If yes then for which organization?
- Do you understand that you cannot independently adopt out the dog/puppy yourself?
 You may promote adoption for the animal, and refer people to speak with Jamie's Animal Rescue. All adoption processes must go through Jamie's Animal Rescue.
- Do you understand that as a rescue, we cannot determine or predict how long an animal will need to be in foster care? Are you committed to helping as long as the animal needs placement?
- Do you understand that puppies CANNOT go anywhere public, on walks, or attend events till they have had at least two puppy boosters in their system?
- Are you able to take the animal to scheduled vet appointments? We will work with your schedule.
- Are you able to attend Saturday adoption events? Most of our events take place on Saturdays from 12-3:00 at Petsmart in Richmond (5574 W Grand Parkway S) and during the cooler months we attend an occasional Houston market. Fosters are not required to stay (but its preferred)
- Are you willing to keep a constant and open flow of communication with the rescue? It is
 very important for the rescue to know how the animal is progressing and what needs to
 be met, and also to receive photos in order to promote the animal.

It is very important for a foster to understand that a given time cannot be predicted. It is a foster's job to care for, love, and train an animal in the process of the adoption. You may not physically or emotionally hurt the animal in the process. If you feel you cannot handle the dog properly, then Jamie's Animal Rescue must be contacted immediately. Fosters SAVE LIVES. I have adopted out almost 1,000 animals in the past 9 years, and those lives would not have been given a second chance without the help of fosters.
